






## **Sport with purpose**

The wool industry recognises the need to boost the awareness of wool as a natural, renewable product. A global shearing-sports tour, with **repeatable**, year-round coverage can help tell that story.





#### **The Southern Series**

The first step in the development of World Series Shearing was the launch of **The Southern Series** in 2022 at the New Zealand Agricultural Show. This year the Peninsula Shears in

Duvauchelle was added to the schedule and in 2025 the concept will be expanded to incorporate events from around the world, culminating in a **series final in Christchurch**.





#### Media coverage

In 2024/25 World Series Shearing events will be live-streamed to digital channels, with highlights and magazine-style content made available for diverse platforms.

This a unique opportunity for event organisers to support their partners, local communities and commercial hubs.

The Series will also offer a consistent stream of stories in various formats to broadcasters, partners, radio, print and digital media.








## Shearing tells a tale

- Green sheep don't kill dolphins






#### **Changing demographics**

Live shearing events can reach audiences in the hundreds of thousands.\* Live-streaming of the 2023 New Zealand Corriedale Championships reached more than 20,000 organic viewers (with no marketing), a 10-fold increase on the previous year. The demographic breakdown shows a predominantly New Zealand and Australian, rural, audience aged upwards of 40 years of age.

By aggressively targeting a new, younger, more global audience World Series Shearing can change that demographic.
